



Coordinator's Corner

Growing up, I spent a lot of time with my two brothers and two sisters. There are only 7 years between the youngest and the oldest, and we enjoyed playing in the yard or hanging out in the house. On one occasion, my parents announced that they needed to take care of some business and they would be back in an hour. They put my sister in charge with some instructions, got in the blue Ford station wagon, and drove up the street. We just stood in the driveway looking in the direction of the car until my sister finally said, "What are you guys looking at? We've got stuff to do. Let's go!"

I can only imagine what it was like to watch Jesus taken up into the clouds, but I think the two men dressed in white garments felt like my sister. Jesus had just told the disciples that they would receive the Holy Spirit and be his witnesses "throughout Judea, Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." The disciples had work to do. Or as my mom would say, "the dishes aren't going to wash themselves!" We can understand the disciples looking up into the sky. What an awe-inspiring experience it must have been to witness that event. Still, there's only so much time for gawking, and the two men rightly asked, "why are you standing there looking at the sky?"

We've all had these kinds of "mountaintop" experiences, times when we've felt God's presence in a uniquely powerful way. Perhaps it was a retreat experience or a visit to a profoundly beautiful place. Maybe it was a moment of prayer or the final moments of an important gathering. We all can understand the feeling of not wanting something to end or to be so inspired by something that time seems to stand still. We should be deeply grateful for those sacred moments and treasure those memories for the rest of our lives.

The two men in our first reading, however, remind us that being a disciple of Jesus means being a witness at all times and in all places. Disciples witness Jesus' love, Jesus' mercy, and Jesus' forgiveness. Disciples witness the truth that Jesus Christ is Lord of heaven and earth. Disciples stand against injustice and oppression and stand with those on the margins. This is no easy task.

Of course, you are never alone. Even the apostles were instructed to wait in Jerusalem until they had received the Spirit. Jesus knew it was tough out there! Trust and rely on the power of the Holy Spirit, and do not become discouraged if you fall short once in a while. God loves you and the Spirit will always be there to inspire you and lift you up.

Jubilee 2025



At his General Audience on May 28, 2025, Pope Leo XIV continued his reflections on the Jubilee theme, Christ our Hope, by focusing on the parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:29–37). He urged the faithful to recognize compassion as the heart of Christian life, saying, "Before being a religious matter, compassion is a question of humanity! Before being believers, we are called to be human."

The pope emphasized that true discipleship is not measured by religious status or knowledge, but by our willingness to show mercy and stand in solidarity with others, especially those who are suffering. "Compassion is the language of God," he said, encouraging all Christians to go beyond rigid judgments and see the face of Christ in those who are wounded, marginalized, or in need.

Pope Leo also renewed his heartfelt appeals for peace in regions torn by conflict, particularly Gaza and Ukraine. He reminded the Church that living out the Gospel means responding with love and mercy in a world that desperately needs healing.

Let us take this message to heart by striving to be instruments of compassion and peace in our daily lives.
