

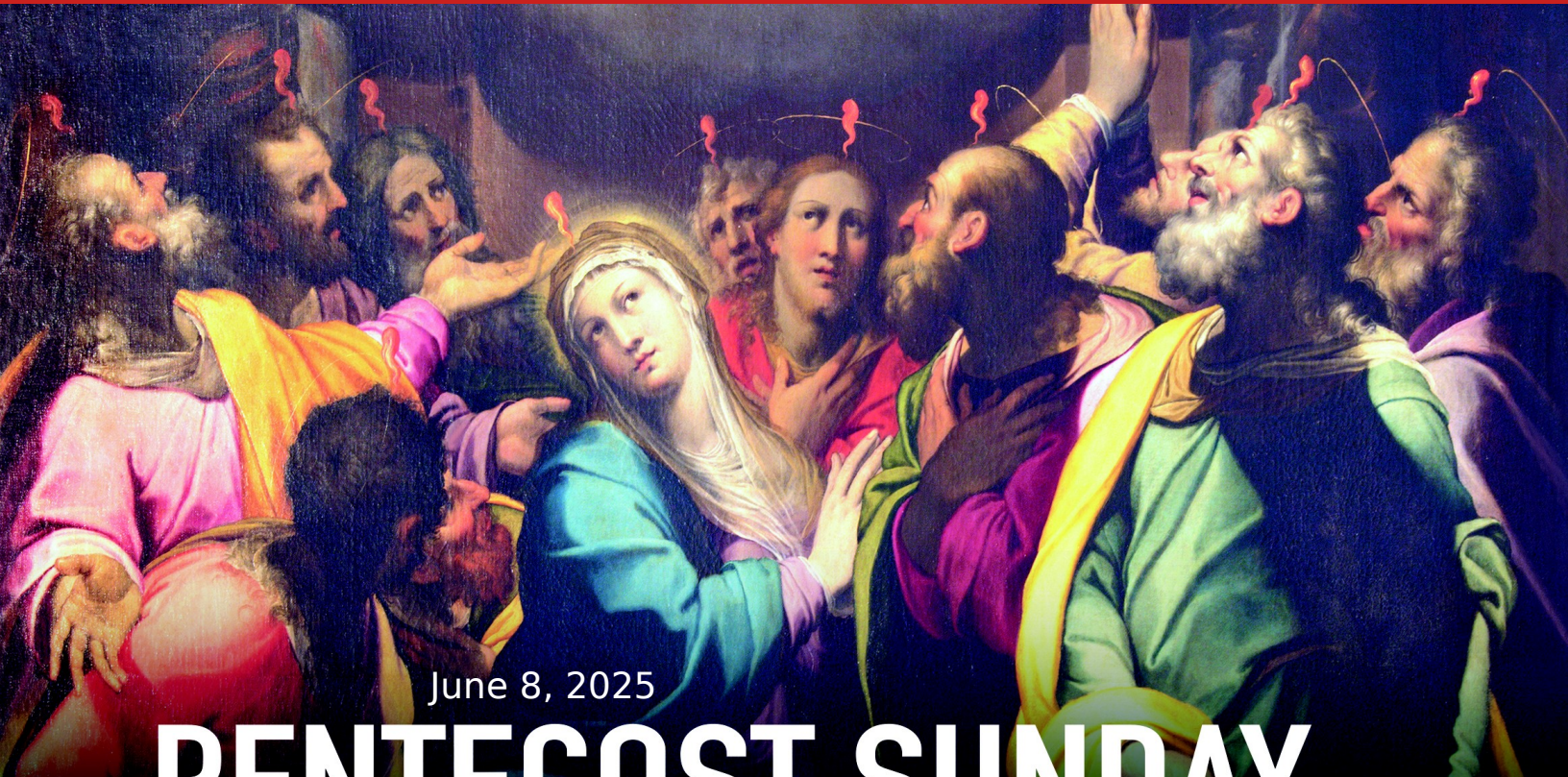

Coordinator's Corner

The author of Acts of the Apostles describes a powerful scene filled with a strong, driving wind that filled the entire house. The Holy Spirit, in the form of tongues of fire, parted and came to rest on each of them. St. Paul reiterates this point when he explains that there is one Spirit but different gifts and different forms of service. The Holy Spirit, then, dwells in each of us as individuals and inspires us as individuals.

You are gifted! The way the Holy Spirit calls you to spread God's love in the world is unique to you. No one experiences the Holy Spirit quite like you, and the Holy Spirit comes to rest on you as you are right now and not as you could be in the future. You have everything you need to put the gifts of the Holy Spirit into action today.

Unfortunately, we tend to make excuses. I'm too old. I'm not ready. I'm dealing with a lot right now. I'm really sinful. I have some disabilities. I'm an addict. I'm not that smart. No one listens to me anyway. It doesn't make a difference. I'm nervous. I need to get my life straightened out.

Do any of those resonate with you? Me, too. The Good News is that the Holy Spirit does not look for perfection; the Spirit looks for a willing heart. The fundamental question is simply this: do you believe the Holy Spirit would come to rest on a person like you? Given all your faults and imperfections, all your doubts and fears, all your struggles, do you really believe God would come to dwell in you? The Church answers that with a resounding YES!! And I say most definitely....YES!! God's Spirit dwells in you for a reason, and God's Spirit, and the gifts the Spirit brings, are ready to transform the world in a way that is unique to you.

Never worry if your experience of the Spirit is different than those around you. There is no need to boast and never a reason to compare. Take time, each day, to ask the Spirit to enter you more deeply and to inspire you more clearly. If what you believe the Spirit is calling you to do is true, then someone's life will benefit, the world will benefit.

A good friend once reminded me to look in the mirror each day and smile. It's a good way to remember that God loves me, the Holy Spirit is in me, and I'm alright. In the midst of everything that makes up my complicated life, I'm alright. So are you! And may the peace of God's Spirit fill you today and always. Happy Pentecost Sunday!

How Do You Pray?

"One consistent message in the Bishop's Pastoral Letter is how we need to dedicate at least fifteen minutes a day in prayer. This may seem difficult as you try to prepare for work, get the children ready for school, take the dog for a walk. We can complicate our life with God by our own expectations. You can start simply by saying, "Good morning, thank you Jesus!" as your feet first hit the floor. Then seeing your spouse prompts a, "Bless them Jesus!", as does seeing each child as they spill milk on their cereal....and the table! Driving to work you can see the sun shining through the trees and thank God for their life as they absorb heat and cool our environment. As you see God everywhere, you will start to desire to sit with Him. You may find a few minutes to read a psalm in the Bible before you go to sleep at night. Or, set your radio alarm to a Christian radio station to wake to music dedicated to God and let it touch your heart. The Holy Spirit dwells in you and you can let Him move you, as the days go by, to spend more time with God. Mother Teresa said: "God speaks in the silence of the heart. Listening is the beginning of prayer." Sit with Him." -Pat Takacs

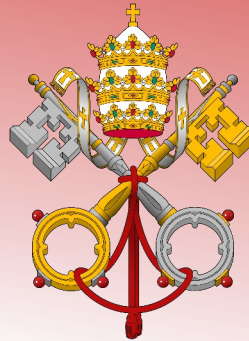

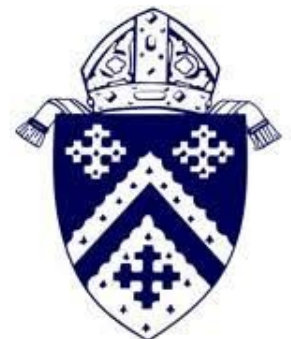
