2024 Lenten Obligations

The days of both fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday

The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

Fasting means to limit oneself to one full meal with two smaller meals which together do not equal the size of your full meal.

The obligation of fasting applies only to Catholics ages 18 - 59.

Abstinence means to abstain from eating meat. The obligation of abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14.

Love Without Measure...

A famous musician was debuting a new work which he had just written for the piano. As he struck the last chord, the audience rose to their feet applauding in appreciation. A reporter from the Plain Dealer, Arts Section, came to interview the musician, "That was an amazing piece of music," he said. "But can you explain to me what the music is about? What it means to you?" The musician looked at the reporter for a long time in silence, and then he sat down and played the piece again.

This was the musician's way of saying that the music cannot be explained. It must be heard. Indeed some of the most important events in life and deepest mysteries cannot be analyzed. Many times when we try; we grow frustrated by the task, and finally comment, "You had to be there." We cannot explain God or understand who God is. But we can have experiences in our life when for a moment we catch a glimpse of God's goodness and God's glory. This is one of Mark's aims in today's gospel of the Transfiguration of Jesus. He fills the scenes with mysterious elements such as the dazzling white clothes, the cloud that overshadows the disciples, and the voice that comes from the heavens. All of these are in the story because Mark knows that we cannot explain God's glory, we can only embrace it.

Yet despite the fact that Mark would insist that the glory of Christ cannot be analyzed or packaged, he does not leave clues in this story of how Jesus' glory can be repeated. He uses the two characters of Moses and Elijah to point to ways in which we can experience the glory of Christ in our own lives. In the First Book of Kings, Elijah experiences God's presence on the holy mountain of Horeb. Although Elijah expects to experience God in thunder and in lightning, God comes to him in a quiet whispering sound. The experience of Elijah tells us that we can find the glory of God in the small but true blessings of our lives, the blessings that we experience every day. Children can be that blessing. A sudden smile from a spouse, a beautiful sun set over Lake Erie, a newborn baby, a spring breeze. All of these ordinary, everyday experiences are common blessings if we take the time to let them be so for us and let God's glory be revealed.

The character of Moses points in a different direction. Moses experienced God's presence on Mount Sinai when he received the gift of the law. The law was God's gift to Israel. It gave direction to serving God through the service of others. So the experience of Moses tells us that we can find the glory of God as we reach out to be of service to our neighbor. As we attempt to reach out to a depressed family member or a neighbor who has lost a job, the immigrant and refugee who is trying to find a new life among us, or the marginalized among us: the imprisoned, victims of violence or abuse, when we reach out we are sharing the love of God and being held by that love ourselves. God's love tells us that every person is a beloved daughter or son.

The glory of God cannot be explained, it must be experienced. But the characters of Moses and Elijah point to where those experiences can be found. In this holy season of Lent, let us rededicate ourselves to follow Elijah by noticing the blessings that surround us and to follow Moses by reaching out to those in need. In these two ways, we can come to see the love that God has for us and catch a glimpse of the glory that shines in the face of the transfigured Christ.

This film reminds us how the NAACP chose her; how four US Marshalls kept back the angry mob bent on lynching her; how a courageous white teacher pushed back against racist superiors and coworkers; and most of all, how her courageous mother, shared the deep faith that gave Ruby the strength to persist in spite of the hatred around her.

Fast from anger and hatred. Give your family an extra dose of love each day.

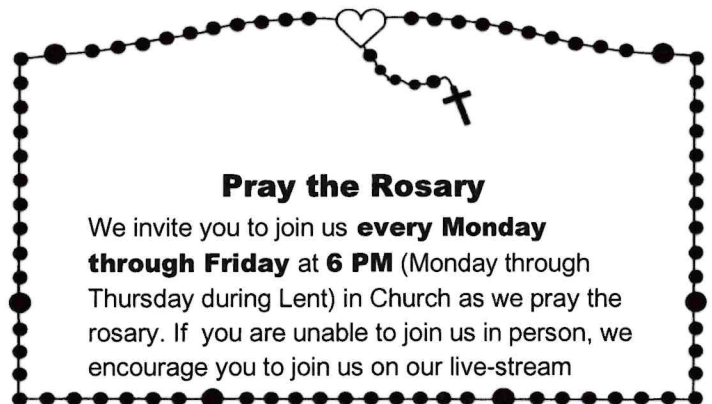
Fast from judging others. Before making judgments, recall how Jesus overlooks our faults.
