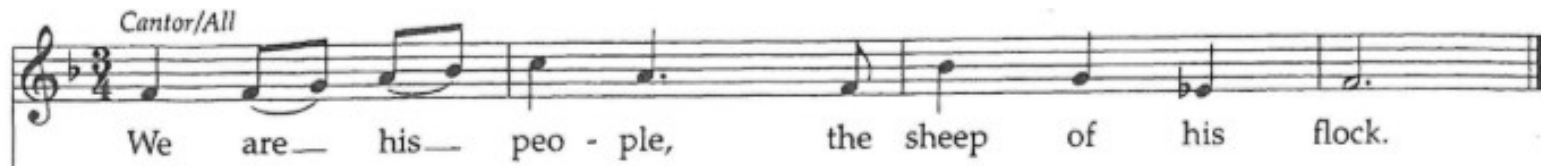

Deanery News



**Catholic Diocese
of Cleveland**

In the recent Code of Canon Law (Church Law), Bishops were given the authority to assemble parishes into smaller, geographical groups, those closer to each other. These groups of parishes within a diocese were then put under the care of a “dean” and the groups called “deaneries”. The word “dean” comes from Latin meaning a “leader in charge”. The purpose of this arrangement is to assist the bishop in his administration of the diocese, especially when it is a large region.

As we have wrapped up our Lenten study of Bishop Malesic’s Pastoral Letter, our parish is committed to strengthening our connection with the wider Deanery. We look forward to sharing the ministries, events, and opportunities happening at nearby parishes—fostering collaboration and community with those geographically closest to us. Coordinator's Corner

The image of Jesus as a shepherd, the Good Shepherd, is one of the most well-known biblical images. Ironically, few of us know or understand the role of the shepherd. This was not the case in the 1st century; most, if not all, had a good idea of how shepherding worked and the importance of sheep recognizing the voice of their shepherd.

Parents and children have a similar experience. In the middle of a playground or at a crowded soccer field, kids always recognize the voice of their mom or dad calling out their name. Similarly, it never seemed to matter how many people were making noise, if my son yelled, "Dad," my head would snap around. I always recognized his voice.

Recognizing the voice of another develops over time. Shepherds spend countless hours with their flocks training them, nurturing them, and building trust. Sheep will instinctively move away from an unfamiliar voice and only follow the command of a voice they know. What a joyful sight it is when a young toddler hears the voice of a parent or grandparent! Their faces light up with a big smile and bright eyes. There is no safer place than in the arms of the ones who gave you life.

How many of us long to hear the voice of Jesus, the Good Shepherd? Sometimes, we may wonder if he is still speaking to us or why we're having a hard time hearing him. The experience of the shepherd or the parent can be helpful. Our ability to hear and recognize the voice of Jesus develops over time. Only when we spend time in prayer, spend time in the scriptures, and spend time in worship, can we expect our ability to hear the Shepherd improve.

Even when we've developed a trusting relationship with the Lord, hearing his voice remains a challenge. Why? Because there's lots and lots of noise in the world. Many other voices are competing for our attention, and their combined volume can drown out the loving voice of the Lord..

Our responsibility as disciples, then is two-fold. First, we need to spend time with the Shepherd. That's why Bishop Malesic, in his pastoral letter, encouraged each of us to spend at least 15 minutes a day in prayer. Try your best! Any effort to commune with Jesus will bear fruit. Second, we need to remove excess noise from our lives. What do we read? What do we watch? What fills our ears each day? Taking account of the noise we allow into our lives each day can be instructive. Some is out of our control, but a good amount can be reduced or eliminated. One thing is for certain: Jesus is still speaking!
