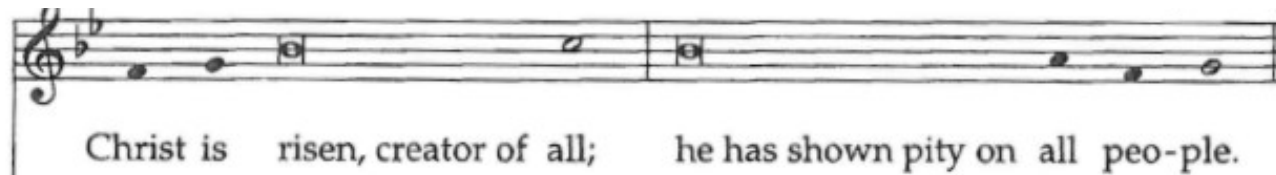

Coordinator's Corner

Every parish has a core group of volunteers, dedicated parishioners (and others) who selflessly sacrifice to keep the parish humming. These are the folks who serve in multiple ministries, offer to take charge of a ministry, commit to a weekly ministry, and are always ready to lend a hand. Without this core, parishes could not function; of course, the larger the parish, the larger the core (and vice versa). St. Augustine has this core of people, and I am so grateful for these familiar faces who always jump in when a need arises. Thank you for your commitment to our parish!

As you might imagine, every parish would love to see this core expand. Adding new and younger faces to the mix creates an energy in the parish and spreads the burden of keeping a parish vibrant across a greater number. As we at St. Augustine look to the future, the goal is clear: our core needs to grow.

I know many of you were disappointed that the fish fries did not happen during Lent and that the Seder Meal was cancelled during Holy Week. These activities, and others like it, require willing hands, and not just people willing to help on the day of the event, but people willing to plan and organize the events. Anything worth being done is worth being done well.

Our experience mirrors that of the early church. The apostles gathered others around them and began to travel from town to town preaching the good news of Jesus. These early missionaries identified leaders in each town who were willing to organize and nurture the newly formed faith communities. These were the core faithful. Without them, the church could not have thrived.

Where might God be calling you to connect or re-connect with St. Augustine? There are needs across the board. We're looking for youth and adult servers at Mass along with ushers and greeters. We will be adding members to both the Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Council. We will need planning committees for the Seder Meal and the Fish Fries if they're going to happen again. Growing up at St. Gabriel parish, we had a dedicated group of women called the Heavenly Dusters who faithfully cleaned the church every week, and to this day, one of my friends, Mark, spends his Monday mornings on the Mop Squad at St. John Vianney parish in Mentor.

Yes, we have challenges in Tremont that do not exist in Mentor, but the reality remains the same. Parishes that thrive regularly expand their core. I want us to thrive at St. Augustine! So if there's an invitation offered to you, consider it. Pray about it. If you have an idea and are willing to see it through, call me. Let's talk! A wise woman told me this week, "It's time to dream big." Remember the gospel story from today. The disciples had been fishing all night with no success. They were tired and disappointed. Why keep trying? Little did they know that a huge catch awaited them off the right side of the boat. They just needed to do what Jesus asked.
